Newnan Kennel Club 2015 Spring Show Report April 18, 2014

As most of you are aware, our Spring Show has shown a steady decline in the number of entries for approximately the past 3 years. This is in part due to a 4-day Cluster in Concord, NC, which began at about the same time as our entries began to decrease. In addition, the weather has not been particularly cooperative for our outdoor event. Because of these factors and the financial losses to our Club, your Board has asked the Show Committee to investigate alternative dates and locations for our Spring Show. We are currently considering changing our show date to the 16th weekend (April 18/19, 2015). AKC has confirmed that these dates are not in conflict with any other Clubs. Jim Miller Park, in Marietta, GA, is available for our use on these dates, and all rings would be either indoors or under permanent cover. Another option, although not as preferable due to its "isolation", is the Heard County Arena, in Franklin, GA, which may also be large enough for all of the rings to be under permanent cover. We are planning to visit these facilities, beginning with Jim Miller Park, and will have more information at our Annual Meeting.

We welcome everyone's suggestions, comments & thoughts regarding this potential change. Let us hear from you!
